Course Description

In this course we will examine the fundamentals of phonetics, in particular the sounds and symbols that are used in the pronunciation of English. The goal of the course is to provide students with a basic understanding of phonetics and of the sound system of English by means of a combination of lectures presenting the issues, practical group exercises, where there will be an opportunity to practice the principles discussed in lectures, and homework assignments. This class will be aimed at students with little or no previous background in phonetics.

Course Textbook

Students can also read one or more of the additional recommended books below. Students are responsible for being familiar with the information in the textbook and from the lectures, handouts and exercises. Everything will be included in the examinations.

Phonetic Software
